

# ACT No. IV OF 1928.

[PASSED BY THE INDIAN LEGISLATURE.]

(Received the assent of the Governor General on the  
15th March, 1928.)

## An Act further to amend the Inland Bonded Warehouses Act, 1896, for certain purposes.

**W**HEREAS it is expedient further to amend the Inland  
Bonded Warehouses Act, 1896, for the purposes here-  
inafter appearing; It is hereby enacted as follows:—

**1.** This Act may be called the Inland Bonded Warehouses Short title.  
(Amendment) Act, 1928.

**2.** (1) In sub-section (1) of section 4 of the Inland Bonded Amendment of  
section 4,  
Act VIII of  
1896.  
Warehouses Act, 1896 (hereinafter referred to as the said  
Act),—

(a) the words “ with the previous sanction of the Local  
Government ” and the words “ with the like sanc-  
tion ” shall be omitted; and

(b) the following proviso shall be added, namely:—

“ Provided that, where a warehouse is to be wholly  
or partly in the charge of officers serving under  
a Local Government, it shall not be appointed  
or licensed as an inland bonded warehouse until  
the Local Government has signified its assent  
to such appointment or license.”

(2) In sub-section (2) of the same section, the following  
words shall be added at the end, namely:—

“ and, if the owner so desires, as if goods, in respect of  
which the procedure laid down in sections 90, 91  
and 92 of the said Act has been complied with, were  
goods already warehoused at a warehousing port  
within the meaning of section 105 of the said Act.”

**3.** In sections 5 and 7 of the said Act, for the words “ Local Amendment of  
sections 5 and  
7, Act VIII  
of 1896.  
Government ” the words “ Chief Customs-authority ” shall  
be substituted.
